Caveat: this service is only available to Virgin subscribers, and text message fees may or not apply depending on your plan.

From the Freaks on the Street File, Paul over at modaco.com reports that he has found a way to possibly speed up the access of web pages over the internet by entering DNS Server specific IP address for the DNS servers out there in cyber space. From what I was able to gather, it may only apply to the UK, but please check it out, and let him know if it works.
